Founded in 1970 by its conductor, Neil Mantle, Sinfonia has performed over two hundred concerts in its 30 year history. The orchestra has a wide range of repertoire but has become noted for its Mahler performances which have for many years been a feature of the Edinburgh Festival Fringe Music. Sinfonia is proud to be able to claim the first performance in Scotland of Richard Strauss' mighty Alpine Symphony and more recently to be the first non-professional orchestra to programme the Elgar/Payne Third Symphony. The orchestra's Mahler series is steadily being released on CD, on sale at our concerts, from our Website and from Chandler's, 33 West Nicholson Street, Edinburgh. The success of these recordings does much to spread Sinfonia's name beyond the U.K.
